The literacy and numeracy catch-up premium gives schools additional funding to support year 7 pupils who did not achieve the expected standard in reading or maths at the end of key stage 2 (DfE).

For the academic year 2017-8, The John of Gaunt School received the same funding as the previous year.

Tier 1	Additional Maths/English Faculty intervention	KS2 test score of <94 in maths and <100 in reading comprehension (or if reading age is below 12)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Small group tuition with teacher or HLTA. - Tutor time maths booster sessions delivered by HLTA. - In class support for targeted students with maths & English TAs.
Tier 2	Individual Learning Department Intervention	KS2 test score of ≤90 in maths and <100 in reading comprehension (or if spelling age is below 12 and/or reading age is below 10)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Small group interventions in reading (SRA corrective reading programme) and spelling, delivered by SEN teachers or experienced TA's. - Small group maths intervention delivered by a TA.
Tier 3	Transition Curriculum	KS2 test score of ≤80 in maths and ≤90 in English (or reading/spelling ages below 10) or were not entered for KS2 tests.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Full curriculum support within the transition group (very low numbers). - High focus on phonics (sound discovery programme), spelling intervention and number bonds (success with arithmetic programme). - Adapted curriculum time with increased English & maths. - Experienced teacher delivering all English & maths. - Additional small group support with SEN specialists as required.
