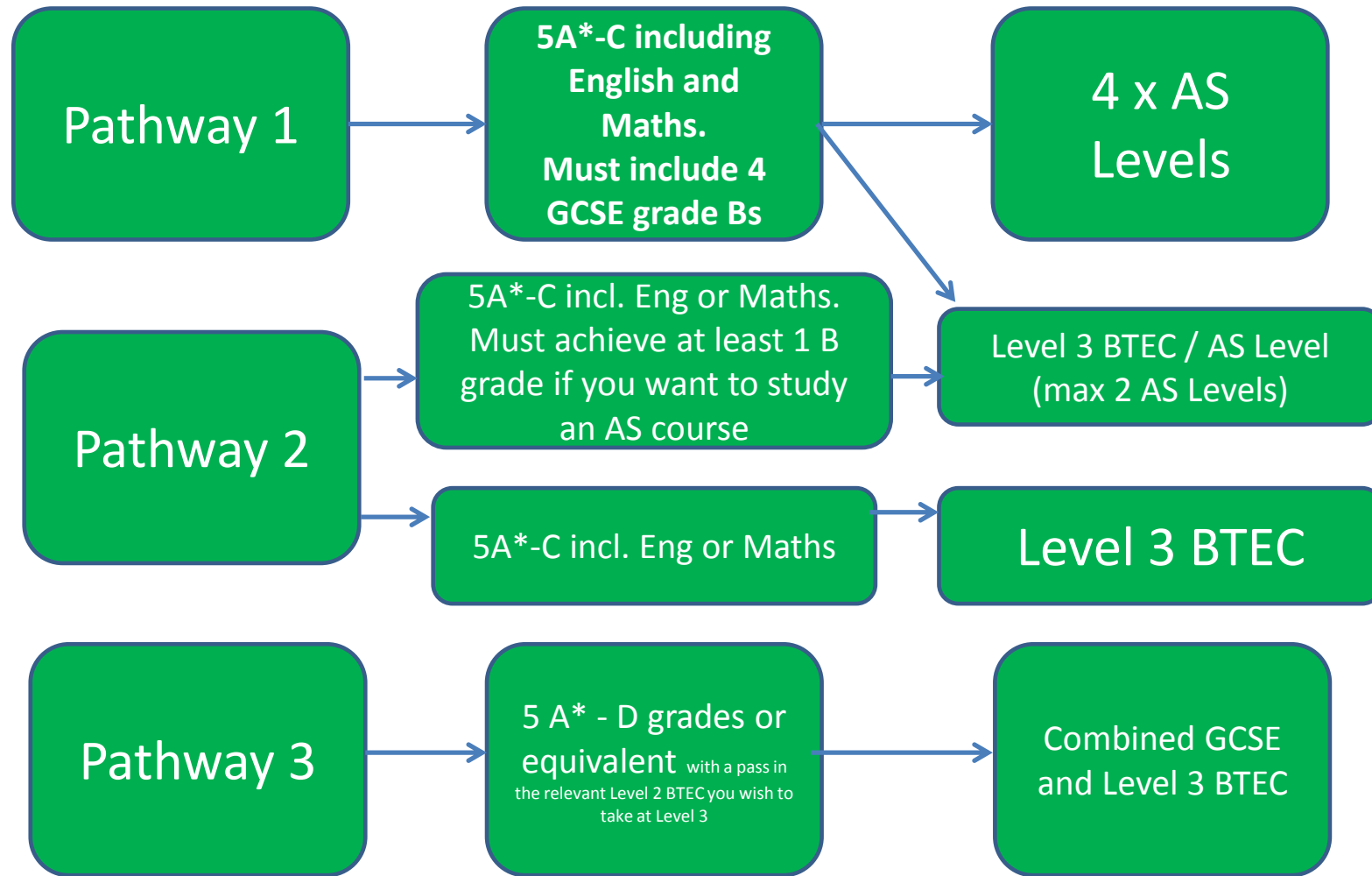

In addition, we run as extra- curricular options 'AS Critical Thinking, AS Art History and the Extended Project Qualification'. Each course only counts as one qualification for the purposes of entry to the Sixth Form.
Individual circumstances will be considered.

In Year 12 most students will study four subjects. For A Level a grade B is recommended in your chosen subjects. A grade B is essential in Maths, Physics, Biology, Chemistry and Languages GCSE in order to take these subjects at A Level. An A or A* grade is necessary in Maths GCSE to take Further Maths at A Level. A grade B in Maths GCSE is needed to study Physics A Level. Please refer to the subject information supplied by staff.
